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2.5.2 - Reforms initiated on Continuous Internal Evaluation(CIE) system at the institutional level (250 words)

The standard continuous internal evaluation process that has been in place at Balurghat College for several years has been continued in the academic year 2017-2018 as well. Allmost all the departments conducted class tests during academic session 2017-2018, and also field projects in some departments are included as a part of internal evaluation procedure during this academic session. . Selection tests were conducted for all 3 years in UG, in February 2018.

2.5.3 – Academic calendar prepared and adhered for conduct of Examination and other related matters (250 words)

Academic calendar had been prepared well in advance before commencement of the academic session 2017-18, and hardcopies of the academic calendar were distributed among various stakeholders before commencement of the academic session. B.A., B.Sc and B.Com 3 year Hons and general examinations are conducted by University of GourBanga, and Balurghat College was chosen as one of the examination centre. The dates given by the university for examination had been adhered to strictly, and examination process has been completed in timely manner both for theory and practical examinations. An orientation programme for 1st year students has been conducted for all 1st year Hons students on 6-7 September, 2017. Dept. of Bengali has organised a special lecture to commemorate the inauguration of Smart Class room on 5th January 2018. Students Exhibition was organised on 11-13 January 2018, the dates of which were initially mentioned as month of January 2018 in the academic calendar.

	Despite the constraints regarding curriculum development, The college introduces innovative ideas within the curriculum to make it more effective regarding content delivery. This includes field excursions, local industry visit and project works, which enhances the cognitive ability of the students. The curriculum of the PG courses are designed by the College as it has the autonomy to do so.
Teaching and Learning	All the departments conducted class tests and laboratory tests , wherever applicable, as a part of CIE, which definitely enhanced the quality of teaching learning process as the students became more prepared for the final University exam throughout the year, and the effective outcome of the curriculum delivery became more evident. ICT tools are used in more extent during teaching learning process, as official smart class room has been inaugurated in the college on 5th January, 2018. Dept. of Mathematics started Coaching cum remedial classes to prepare the students for competitive exams e.g. IIT JAM, TIFR, etc.
